## **Integrated Morphoelectric and Transcriptomic Classification of Cortical GABAergic Cells**

To better constrain the definition of neuronal cell types, the authors characterized the transcriptomes and intrinsic physiological properties of over 4,200 mouse visual cortical GABAergic interneurons and reconstructed the local morphologies of 517 of those neurons. They found that most transcriptomic types (t-types) occupy specific laminar positions within visual cortex, and, for most types, the cells mapping to a t-type exhibited consistent electrophysiological and morphological properties. ## HDAC6 Promotes Growth, Migration/Invasion, and Self-Renewal of Rhabdomyosarcoma

In this study, the authors used functional assays in vitro and in vivo (zebrafish and xenograft mouse models) to demonstrate the crucial role of HDAC6, a cytoplasmic histone deacetylase, in driving rhabdomyosarcoma tumor growth, self-renewal, and migration/invasion. Treatment with HDAC6-selective inhibitors recapitulated the HDAC6 loss-of-function phenotypes. **Abstract**


